




ASD Pilot Projects and Resources for Schools



ASD Ministry Pilot Projects

40 Hour online Registered Behaviour Technician Course based on the RBT task list.

Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) to oversee training and implementation in school setting for 25 EA's.







ASD Ministry Pilot Projects

Dedicated Space for external ABA providers to provide ABA services in a natural environment.

Any child who attends First Avenue, has a diagnosis of ASD and is receiving ABA service is eligible to participate in the pilot regardless of funding options.

7 schools -Kindergarten to grade 2

Maximum 6 students with 2 educators
8 sessions





ASD Ministry Pilot Projects 2017/18

Art of Play -6 schools -Kindergarten to grade 2

Maximum 6 students with 1 teacher and 1 EA
6 week program x2 days per week

Art of Conversations - 3 schools Grade 3 to grade 6
Maximum 6 students 1 teacher and 1 EA
6 week program x2 days per week

PEERS - 6 high schools spring of 2017
3 intermediate sites spring of 2018,
Maximum 6 students with 1 teacher and 1 EA
6 week program x2 days per week
