• ELD classes- small class size, half day in ELD class, half day in regular class









Accommodations


Learning at grade level with supports like:

ESL/ELD Support in Secondary

• **Classroom teachers:** teaching English through the content of their course, accommodations for MLs

• **Guidance Counsellor:** help choosing courses, connecting with community resources







What every student needs to graduate




Getting 40 Volunteer Hours

What is a credit?

• A student earns one credit for every class they pass in a semester.

• A student will usually take 4 classes each semester, for a total of 8 classes or credits.

Other Opportunities and Programs Available to grade 11 and 12 Students

SWAC (School Within a College)

Students earn college credits while studying in high school.

SHSM (Specialist High Skills Major)

Grade 11 and 12 students can gain certificates and real-world experience in a field that interests them.

Other Opportunities and Programs Available to grade 11 and 12 Students

OYAP (Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program)

Opportunity to complete studies towards a high school diploma while beginning an apprenticeship program.

<u>Co-op</u>

Students gain credits while getting work experience in a field that interests them.
