WHAT IS THE PROCESS OF SELF-IDENTIFICATION?

- Parents/Guardians of children under 18 years of age are able to identify their children as having First Nations, Métis, or Inuit ancestry.
- Students over 18 years of age are able to self-identify as having First Nations, Métis, or Inuit ancestry.
- Self-identification is a personal choice and no proof of ancestry is required.
- Simply complete the form below, and give it to the school.
- The OCDSB will not release any information on individual students, as this goes against the law and our own Board policy.

WHY SELF-IDENTIFY AS FIRST NATIONS, MÉTIS, OR INUIT?

We want to provide First Nations, Métis and Inuit students with educational opportunities that honour their mental, physical, emotional and spiritual well-being.
