MLO Responsibilities

SCHOOL

- Participate in the school reception and orientation process for newcomers.
- Provide orientation to school / community programs and services
- Support families to advocate on their own behalf
 i.e., educational needs of their children.
- Facilitate constructive and culturally sensitive communication between school staff and newcomer students/families
- MLOs act as a bridge between the families and the school
- Provide information to school staff about cultural and settlement-related issues

- Welcome Books for parents and students
- Parent Workshops/Coffee Break Meetings
- Parental involvement in the school community: School Council; Parent Information Days/Nights;
 Cultural Potlucks and Celebrations; Community Field Trips; Guest Speakers/Talent Workshops using parent expertise; Parents Volunteer in the classroom
- Resource Library with dual language books and community resources for newcomers
