Equity, Diversity, Inclusion (EDI) Spotlight

Elementary Program Review

The OCDSB is conducting an <u>Elementary Program Review</u> to enhance the programs and services offered to elementary students across the school board. Student Senators consulted about the new Elementary Program Review during the February meeting. Some key changes include:

- Community-based education with streamlined program offerings available to all students.
- Two program pathways of Enhanced English and French Immersion for Grades 1-8 offered in most schools.
- Flexible entry points into French Immersion. Students have the opportunity to join the French immersion program in grades 1, 2, or 3.
- Support for multilingual learners and for students with complex learning profiles
- Redistribution of resources to neighbourhood schools, with the gradual phase out of 39 Specialized Program Classes.

Al in the Classroom

The Senate received a presentation by Principal Erin O'Grady, from the OCDSB AI steering committee, who are looking to gather student input on the usage of AI in schools. The main themes discussed were:

- How are students already using AI as part of their daily lives?
- How can AI help students in their classrooms?
- What are the main concerns about the use of AI?
- What should students know to use AI more effectively/responsibly?

The insight shared by the Student Senators will be given to the OCDSB AI steering committee to help draft policies and guidelines for the future implementation of AI use in classrooms.

Student Trustee Elections

What is a Student Trustee?

Student Trustees are the official voice of students in the OCDSB. Student Trustees take issues and ideas from Student Senators and present them to the board directly. They are also tasked with representing students at Committee of the Whole meetings and province-wide conferences.

How do elections work?

- 1. By this point, schools should have nominated one candidate to represent them in the Student Trustee elections.
- Through a meeting with the Student Senate and Co-President Council, taking place February 25th, two Student Trustees will be elected from the pool of nominees.
- 3. These two Student Trustees will then represent the voices of all students in the OCDSB.

A third Trustee, the Indigenous Student Trustee, will be chosen later in the year. Keep an eye out for when Student Trustee winners are announced to stay updated!
